



Population – Regional Distribution

- Ontario Population: 14,223,942 (2021)
 - 38.5% of Canada's population resides within the Province of Ontario Canada's largest province
 - Between 2016 and 2021, Ontario's population grew by 5.8%, adding 775,448 residents
- Toronto Census Metropolitan Area (CMA): 6,202,225 (2021)
 - 43.6% of Ontario's population resides within the Toronto CMA Canada's largest metropolitan area and in which the City of Mississauga is located
 - Between 2016 and 2021, Toronto CMA's population grew by 4.6%, adding 274,185 residents

Population – Economic Growth Centres

The City of Mississauga has 5 economic growth centers which are the major nodes of economic activity in the city. These areas are reflected in our economic development strategy.

Aerotropolis:

 A large commercial and industrial area centered around Pearson International Airport (Canada's largest airport), the Aerotropolis is a hub for logistics, life sciences and advanced manufacturing sectors.

Downtown

 Mississauga's downtown area has all the elements of a dynamic city core - civic buildings, cultural facilities, postsecondary institutions (Sheridan College), core transit interchanges and a wide range of retail, recreation and entertainment opportunities.

Lakeside

 With 22 kilometers of waterfront, Lakeside is home to a vibrant entertainment and retail cluster, as well as large scale residential and commercial development projects such as the Lakeview Innovation District

Knowledge District: Meadowvale

 Meadowvale is a key corporate centre for many industries and a hub for Mississauga's Life Sciences cluster.

Knowledge District: Sheridan Science Park & Surrounding Area

 Sheridan Park & Surrounding Area incorporates a wide range of public and private sector research and development activity taking place within Sheridan Business Park and the University of Toronto, Mississauga.

- The City of Mississauga has evenly distributed age cohorts; however residents within 45-59 are the largest cohort.
 - The city's population is expected to grow to 995,000 by 2051



Demographic – Immigration

Toronto Census Metropolitan Area (CMA)

- Immigration is the leading driver of population growth within the Toronto CMA
- Toronto CMA receives a higher share of total immigration into Canada than any other urban centre (36% in 2020/2021)
- The majority of all immigrants admitted to Canada are economic immigrants - meaning they are highly skilled and capable of working in several economic sectors.



City of Mississauga

- The City of Mississauga continues to welcome and benefit from the arrival of new immigrants
- In 2016, Mississauga was home to 53,410 recent immigrants (i.e. immigrants that had landed in Canada between 2011 and 2016). This accounted for 15% of all recent immigrants in Toronto CMA
- By 2016, 55.2% of Mississauga's population was born outside of Canada.

- Canada has two official languages, English and French.
 98% of Canada's population can speak one or both of the official languages and in Mississauga this is marginally lower at 96%.
- Mississauga has a diversity of linguistics.
- Persons whose language spoken at home other than English or French make up 11.5% of Canada's total population, in comparison to 14.4% of Ontario's population, 24.7% of the Toronto CMA's population and 26.2% of Mississauga's population.


